## How to Use the Bible

When in sorrow, read John 14. When men fail you, read Psalm 27. When you have sinned, read Psalm 51. When you worry, read Matthew 6:19-34.

Before church service, read Psalm 84.

When you are in danger, read Psalm 91.

For the blues, read Psalm 34.

When God seems distant, read Psalm 139.

When discouraged, read Isaiah 40.

If you want to be fruitful, read John 15.

When doubts come, try John 7:17.

When lonely or fearful, read Psalm 23.

When you forget your blessing, read Psalm 103.

For Jesus' idea of a Christian, read Matthew 5.

For James' idea of religion, read James 1:19-27.

If faith needs stirring, read Hebrews 11.

When you feel down and out, read Romans 8:31-39.

When the world seems bigger than God, read Psalm 90.

For courage for your task, read Joshua 1. When you want rest and peace, read Matthew 11:28-30.

For assurance, read Romans 8:1-30.

For God's secret of happiness, read Colossians 3:12-17.

When you travel, read Psalm 121.

When you grow bitter or critical, read 1 Corinthians 13.

When your prayers grow narrow or selfish, read Psalm 67.

For Paul's description of Christianity, read 2 Corinthians 5:14-19.

For rules on how to get along with others, read Romans 12.

When you think of investments and returns, read Mark 10:17-31.

For a great invitation and a great opportunity, read Isaiah 55.

For Jesus' idea of prayer, read Luke 11:1-13; Matthew 6:5-15.

For the prophet's picture of worship that counts, read Isaiah 58:1-12.

For the prophet's idea of religion, read Isaiah 1:10-18; Micah 6:6-8.

## The Bible Contains:
